POLICY-MAKING INSIDE EUROPE?

European Parliament, Brussels

16th - 18th June 2015

This will be our eighth special three-day programme of talks, discussions, interviews and visits, involving those at the sharp end of policy and decision-making in Brussels and focussing on issues of current concerns. It is being organised with our colleagues from the Insitute of Political Science in Lisbon, to focus on how European policy is made in Brussels in a range of fields and disciplines. The programme includes visits to the 2014 European Parliament and NATO headquarters. Topics will be likely to include the fallout of the European elections, the work of the new Commission, the Transatlantic Trade and Investment Partnership, the EU's Eastern European and African partnerships, and the economic and political future of Europe. The accent above all is on debate and understanding.

Programme Details: The event will start at lunchtime on Monday, March 2nd, with a half day of talks and discussion, followed by a dinner in the European Parliament special guest dining room on the top floor. Tuesday will include a visit to the European Parliament and the European Commission, more discussions and working groups, and an evening cocktail on Wednesday is scheduled at the NAVO headquarters.
